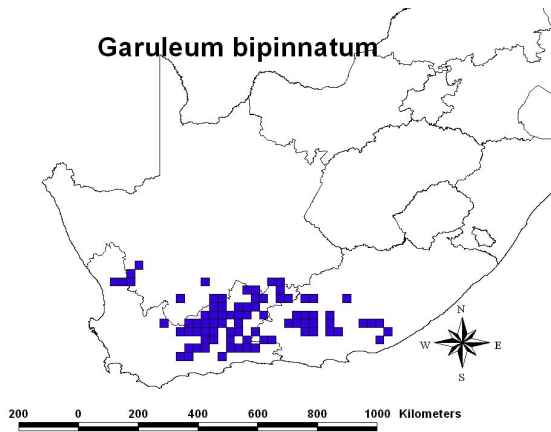


Garuleum bipinnatum

Common name: slanghoutjie, kowerbos

Family: Asteraceae

Habitat: Widespread mudstone and tillite on well-drained rocky hillsides

Plant description: drought-deciduous shrub with easily broken branches, pinnate leaves and blue to white daisy flowers

Palatability: ★★★★★ for sheep

Seed description: Seeds are of three types – white and flat or yellow to brown and cylindrical

Viable seeds per kg: no known

When and how to plant: Spring and autumn. Roughen soil with a spade or implement and sown seed on the surface. Roll or trample the sown area to press the seed firmly onto the soil or rake the sown area with a rake or thorn branch. Cover the whole of the sown area with thorn branches to protect seedlings from livestock or game.
